

## *Keiser University* Fall 2010 150% Graduation Rates of First-time Degree-seeking Students

•Keiser University began offering <u>Bachelor's degrees</u> in Fall 2004, the Fall 2010 first-time, full-time, <u>Bachelor's degree</u>-seeking student cohort was comprised of 147 students. This cohort represents 12.0% of first-time, full-time, undergraduate degree-seeking students entering Keiser University in Fall 2010.

•Keiser University's first-time, full-time, Bachelor's degree-seeking six year graduation rate of 72% exceeds the national average of 59.8%.
