Lakeland, FL—March 6, 2014— Dr. Diane Longstreet, a faculty member for the Bachelor of Science in Dietetics and Nutrition program at the Lakeland campus will be presenting a community program on "Romancing the Plate – How to Fall in Love with Healthy Food" on Thursday, March 27, 2014. Dr. Longstreet is a Florida licensed/registered dietitian with over 30 years of professional experience in health promotion and disease prevention. She also serves as the President of the Cypress Lakes Dietetics Association. Dr. Longstreet has been teaching at Keiser University since March 2012.
