400 Police Explorers from Law Enforcement Agencies throughout Florida Compete Solving Mock Crimes

Daytona Beach, FL—Oct. 28, 2008—The Ormond Beach Police Department and Keiser University co-hosted the Florida Police Explorers' Delegate Training Competition on Saturday, Oct. 25. The law enforcement Exploring Program, a youth program affiliated with the Boy Scouts of America, provides a means through which young men and women may decide through actual experience if they would like to pursue a law enforcement career as adults. This program provides young people with the opportunity for community involvement and develops a greater sense of understanding between the community and the police.

Four hundred police explorers (ages 14-21) representing law enforcement agencies throughout Florida competed to solve mock crimes including a homicide/suicide, felony traffic stops, and a hostage situation. Approximately 25 Keiser University criminal justice and crime scene students and alumni served as the victims and suspects in the scenarios.

Additionally, the Daytona Beach Police Department displayed their BAIT cars, K-9 Unit and SWAT Team.
