High Schools Students Solve Mock-Crimes at Keiser's Daytona Campus

Daytona, Florida—April 23, 2008— On April 15th Keiser University hosted a mock crime scene investigation day at the Daytona Beach campus. Mainland High School and Deland High School students participated in various crime scene scenarios around campus. The scenarios included a school shooting, a murder/kidnapping at a campsite and a domestic violence dispute organized by Keiser University's Criminal Justice and Crime Scene Technology students.

Daytona Beach's SWAT and K9 teams and Deland Police Department's Traffic Homicide and Motorcycle Police Units and others partnered with Keiser University in the interactive event highlighting careers in law enforcement. Students were also given the opportunity to be fingerprinted, tour the campus and observe an Anatomy and Physiology class's dissection assignment.
