Keiser University, through Florida Department of Motor Vehicles, has been granted a license plate. Only four new license plate designs for organizations were granted this legislative session. Right now in order for the state to do a final approval for the KU license plate, Keiser University Campuses throughout the state need to get about 1,000 vouch-

ers from students, faculty and staff to show our commitment. Student Services (along with a committee that is being formed) will be staffing a table to assist students in completing the voucher process.

This Florida license plate costs only \$28.00, payable when you get a letter from the Department of Motor Vehicles later this year.
