Keiser University was honored to have the 10th Judicial Circuit's State Attorney, Jerry Hill as the guest speaker for the March 2014 Criminal Justice - Forensics - Legal Studies Lecturer Series. Mr. Hill spoke to a large gathering of students - sharing his 26 years of experience in what it takes to successfully investigate and prosecute criminal cases. Mr. Hill has worked closely with law enforcement, and students from different areas of study were able to gain a unique perspective from his experience. As Mr. Hill spoke of past cases, investigative successes and errors, courtroom presentation, and the importance of all of the "players" that may not be known

but are crucial to the justice system. The students engaged in detailed and career specific questions. Mr. Hill responded to each making it clear of the students' understanding that their hard work here at Keiser is not just training for "a job" but a foundation

for a wide range of opportunities in their chosen fields.

Mr. Hill was a dynamic guest lecturer that was able to convey to the students that what they are working towards matters

individually but also within the community and society as a whole. His lifelong dedication to and passion for the American Justice System left students with a renewed excitement about the paths they have chosen.


