Sarasota, FL –May 2017— In Keiser University's 40th year the <u>Sarasota campus</u> will hold its spring commencement ceremony on **May 9, 2017 at 7:00 p.m**. for the Sarasota campus at the Bradenton Area Convention Center located at One Haben Blvd., in Palmetto. Over 240 students will cross the stage to accept their degrees in front of their immensely proud family, friends, faculty, and campus staff.
