

Keiser University Fall 2014 150% Graduation Rates of First-time Degree-seeking Students

Keiser University began offering <u>bachelor's degrees</u> in Fall 2004, the Fall 2014 first-time, full-time, <u>Bachelor's degree</u>-seeking student cohort was comprised of 833 students. This cohort represents 35% of first-time, full-time, undergraduate degree-seeking students entering Keiser University in Fall 2014.

Keiser University's first-time, full-time, Bachelor's degree-seeking six year graduation rate of 74.3% exceeds the national average of 63.4%.
