new business degree program and a new satellite campus at the Port St. Lucie campus.

Arthur Keiser, Ph.D., chancellor of the university, announced this week that the university is building a 20,000-square-foot golfing facility in St. Lucie West that will be the location for their new golf management degree program.

School officials have researched potential oppor-

tunities for graduates of the new program and reported that the \$76 billion golf industry provides employment for more than 2 million people in the United States including pro shop managers, tournament operators, course and club staff and managers, among other professions, Keiser said.

Golf is a very important business, especially in this area with the PGA and the many golf courses," Keiser said.

The university is building the new golf facility just across I-95 from the PGA Learning and Performance Center and between the world-famous Professional Golfers' Association (PGA) of America's Port St. Lucie courses.

PGA allows our students to use the training facilities and the golf courses," said Keiser.

Students will practice on the 35-acre lighted practice range, multiple short-game areas, dedicated bunker facility, and extensive putting green complex.

Back at the Keiser University golf facility, students will study their golf game in a multitude of new, high-tech simulators, Keiser said. They will have an

repair and golf retail to golf technology and golf course management, Keiser said.

"And that is the degree they are working toward, an Associate of Science in

Golf Management. It's a business degree and it's accredited."

"It's a business management degree with the emphasis on becoming a golf professional," he added.

Credits towards becoming a PGA professional also are

Classes begin every month so students can begin at almost any time and finish their training in 16 months. And, Keiser said, because it is accredited, students are eligible to apply for federal grants and loans as well as private loans to cover their costs.

Keiser expects the golf facility, which is a satellite campus of the Port St. Lucie campus, to be completed in February.

"But we are enrolling students right now," Keiser said. "They can start earning their generaleducation credits towards their degree at our Port St. Lucie campus while the facility is being completed."

The Port St. Lucie main campus is at 10330 S. U.S. 1 in the plaza between Port St. Lucie Boulevard and Jennings Road.
