STAY ELIGIBLE FOR FINANCIAL AID

You Don't Have to Pay for Help Finding Money for College or Career School

Commercial financial aid advice services can cost well over \$1,000. Of course, simply charging for help or information that's available for free elsewhere is not fraudulent. However, if a company doesn't deliver what it promises, it's scamming you.

If you're unsure whether to pay a company for help finding financial aid, stop and think for a minute: What's being offered? Is the service going to be worth your money? Do the claims seem too good to be true? You might have heard or seen these claims at seminars, over the phone from telemarketers, or online:

"Buy now or miss this opportunity." Don't give in to pressure tactics. Remember, the "opportunity" is a chance to pay for information you could find yourself for free.

"We quarantee you'll get aid." A company could claim it fulfilled its promise if you were offered student loans or a \$200 scholarship. Is that worth a fee of \$1,000 or more?

"I've got aid for you; give me your credit card or bank account number." Never give out a credit card or bank account number unless you know the organization you are giving it to is legitimate. You could be putting yourself Scholanships
KEISER UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

A student who has completed a semester of study in which the cumulative grade point average (CGPA) is 3.3 or higher at that time, may apply for the scholarship. This scholarship will begin from the future semester after the 3.3 CGPA occurred.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Applicant must request the application from the Financial Aid Office.
- Applicant must be eligible to apply / receive Title IV financial aid.
- Applicant must reapply annually (every 8 months) as automatic renewal will not take place.
- Applicant understands the scholarship may be used to cover tuition, fees, books, kits and supplies. The scholarship funds will not cover non-
- Scholarships may be awarded up to a maximum of \$1000.00 per academic year. At no time will the scholarship be disbursed in full during one semester.
- Scholarships are awarded based upon student status and credits to be attempted (which is in turn based upon a student's schedule). The institution reserves the right to alter the award for those students who change their enrollment from days to evenings, withdraw from classes, or withdraw from the institution (thus reducing credits attempted).
- Although awards are calculated and made with reference to an academic year, typically disbursements are awarded in two amounts (which together equal the total award). Such disbursements are typically made once in each semester of the academic year.
- At time of payment the student shall be attending and be in active status for disbursement to take place. The institution will not accelerate funds scheduled for future disbursement for students withdrawing from the institution.
- Recipients are expected to maintain satisfactory academic progress as outlined in the institution's catalog.
- Academic scholarships which have caused a credit balance will be issued to the student at the end of the current academic year.


