



## **Leadership Distinction Program**Fact Sheet

- The Leadership Distinction Program is open to all students.
  - Students must participate in the required number of leadership seminars based upon the length of their program and required number of community service hours:
    - o Associate program: 8 leadership seminars; 8 hours of community service
    - o Bachelor program: 10 leadership seminars; 16 hours of community service
    - o Master program: 8 leadership seminars; 8 hours of community service
  - Seminars will be provided by the Department of Student Services and held on campus in a classroom, auditorium, designated space or virtually as well as made available on a monthly basis.
  - For the following 4 seminars, attendance is required:
    - o Getting the Interview
      - Includes: Cover Letter, Resume, and Thank you
    - The Interview
      - Includes: Interviewing Skills and Soft Skills
    - o Financial Success Strategies
    - o Job Search Using Technology
  - The following seminars will also need to be made available:
    - o The Power of Networking
    - o Study and Reading Strategies
    - o Time Management
    - o Leadership Development and Soft Skills
    - Civic Responsibilities
    - Virtual Interviews
    - o Success in Your Job
    - o Professionalism
    - o Do's and Don'ts of Social Media
    - Career Fair Success
    - Emotional Intelligence
    - o Linked-In
  - Upon completion of the program, the student will receive:
    - o Single red honor cord to wear at graduation and denoted in commencement program
    - o Letter of completion of Leadership Program by Campus President
    - Student Certificate
  - In person sessions, students are required to sign in at the beginning and end of each seminar.
  - All attendance logs will be uploaded to the KU Sharepoint under student services (<u>Home (sharepoint.com)</u>> workshops>sign-in sheets> by respective campus>by respective year. Attendance must be documented in contact manager of Anthology.
  - Students will be required to complete a Leadership Distinction Clearance Form by the Department of Students. This form needs to be filed in the student's permanent file.

**NOTE:** As a student continues his or her education with the institution, his or her seminars in the LDP are cumulative and roll over into the continuing degree program. For community service 8 hours are due at the Associate's level, if reenrolling in the Bachelor's program, 8 more community service hours are required (along w/2 more seminars). If the Bachelor's graduate re-enrolls into a Master's program, then they would only need 8 additional hours of community service.


