Quantum House is a caring and supportive home that lessens the burden for families whose children are receiving treatment in Palm Beach County for a serious medical condition. With the help of dedicated community members like Keiser University, the House relieves stress and financial strain by fulfilling basic needs and providing critical human services, including lodging, meals and a host of family resources. The House opened its doors in 2001 as a haven with 10 bedrooms on the campus of a major medical center. Now with 30 guest suites, the House serves 1,000 family members every year. It's the only organization of its kind between Fort Lauderdale and Orlando.

Keiser University and Quantum House teamed up in September 2016 after the University's volunteer fair. Staff began coming to the House bimonthly to participate in the Chef for a Day program where Keiser planned, purchased and prepared a meal for House families. Chef for a Day is one of the House greatest needs for volunteers and an incredible relief for families.

The House has seen even more Keiser students in the past year. Student athletes have come to the House to help with chores and to play games or do chores with Quantum House kids. They make sure our kids still have opportunities to be kids.
