Master of Science in Occupational Therapy (MSOT) Bridge Program

Program Outcomes

The Accreditation Council of Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) independently accredits all Master of Science in Occupational Therapy (MSOT) Bridge programs. To be eligible to sit for the National Certification Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT) examination, a candidate must evidence graduation from an accredited program.

Number Admitted: The MSOT Bridge program offers admission cycles that vary by campus each calendar year, that may include January, May, and/or September. The maximum number of students admitted annually varies by campus.

Graduation rate: The MSOT Bridge program graduation cycles vary by campus that may include April, August, and/or December. This number includes students who graduate on time, minus the number of students who withdrew due to military, health, family issues, death and other reasons not related to academic and clinical performance. The MSOT Bridge program has an evaluation benchmark of an annual graduation rate > 80%.
